Overview



In 2017-18 the FACS cluster will spend **\$7 BILLION** supporting people with disability, vulnerable children, young people and families to live a better life. This is an increase of **\$459 million** (or 7.1%) on the 2016-17 revised budget.

Reduce the proportion of domestic violence perpetrators re-offending within 12 months by 5%.



CREATING SUSTAINABLE SOCIAL HOUSING

Increase the number of households successfully transitioning out of social housing by 5% over three years.
