### 2017-18 Budget Highlights

TO CONTINUE TO IMPLEMENT THE NSW AGEING STRATEGY 2016–2020 which includes the Elder Abuse Helpline and Resource Unit, Tech Savvy Seniors and the NSW Seniors Card.



ELDER ABUSE HELPLINE AND RESOURCE UNIT provides

information, support and referrals relating to the abuse of older people living in the community across NSW.

**TECH SAVVY SENIORS** provides free or low-cost training through a network of community colleges and libraries to help seniors learn to use computers, tablets and smartphones.

The SENIORS CARD program encourages older people to enjoy an active and healthy retirement.

Currently NSW Seniors Card has more than 1.5 million members and over 5,600 participating businesses.







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# Funded projects from the Liveable Communities Grants Program include:

The GOOD NEIGHBOUR PROJECT, harnessing the value, knowledge, experience and capacity of older volunteers and older refugees in the community by matching them with newly arrived refugees to assist them in their settlement journey.

An open-air 'pop up' VILLAGE CAFÉ, created by Penrith City Council offering older members of the St Mary's community an opportunity to connect with each other, access fresh produce and explore ways of improving their wellbeing as individuals and as a community.

The Playgroup Association of NSW, which will pilot and establish a model of COMMUNITY LED INTERGENERATIONAL PLAYGROUPS in aged care facilities that aim to have three generations engage and participate in activities together rather then just attend alongside each other.
