

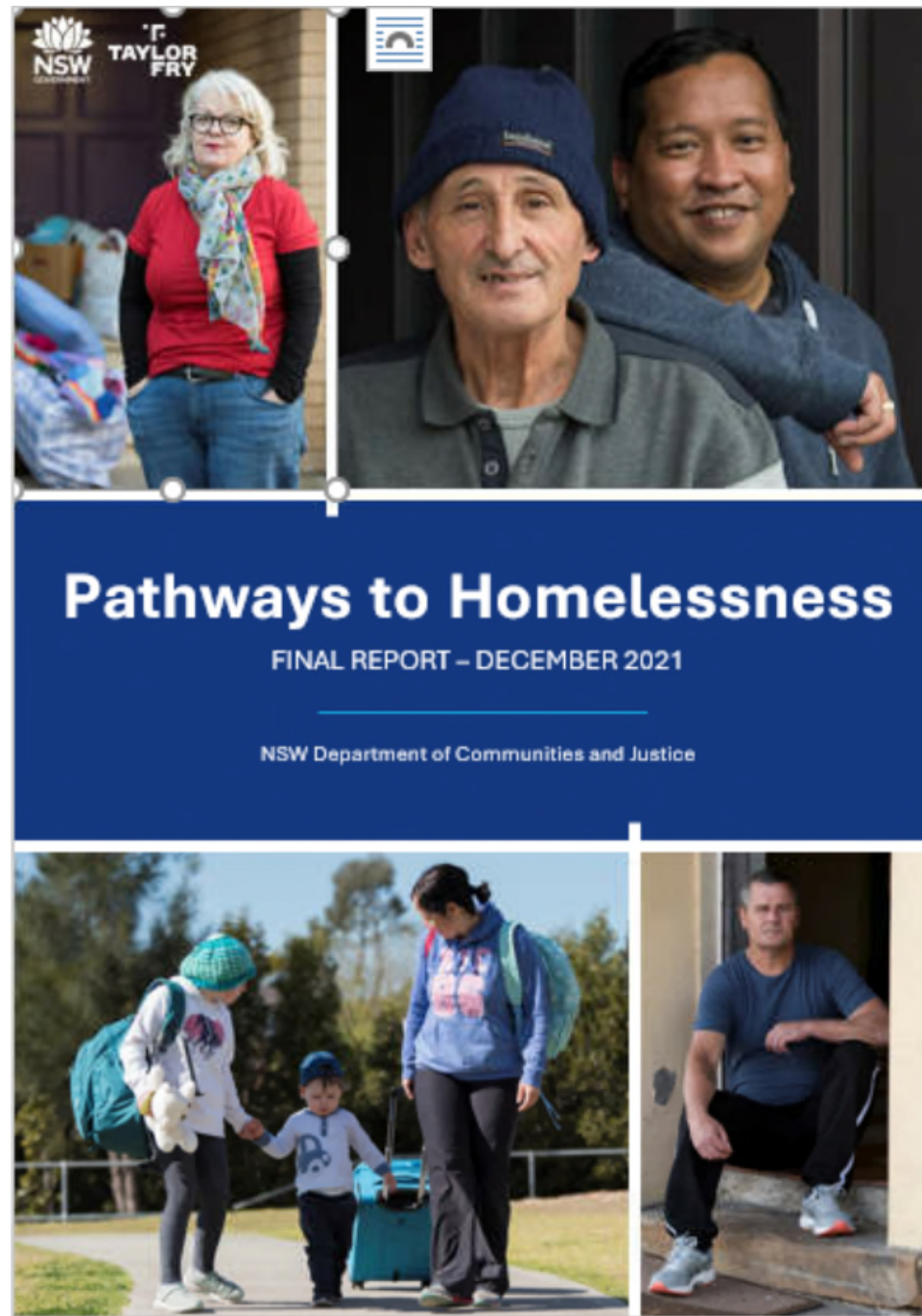

About the Pathways to Homelessness report

Pathways to Homelessness is a key action under the *NSW Homelessness Strategy 2018-2023* to **improve the evidence base for early intervention and prevention** for people at risk of homelessness.

The project focused on four key research questions:

- For people requiring homelessness support, which other government services have they used before?
- For people using other government services, how likely are they to require homelessness support?
- Among the people identified, what other risk factors affect their likelihood of using homelessness services?
- How do government service use costs differ for people requiring homelessness services?

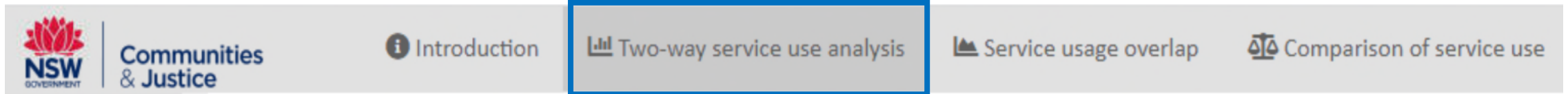
The Pathways to Homelessness report is accompanied by interactive dashboards. These dashboards provide the opportunity to explore the dataset in more depth.

There are **three tables** included in the dashboard:

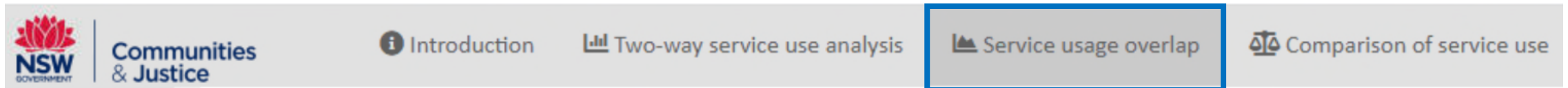
- Two-way service use analysis
- Service usage overlap
- Comparison of service use

The next slide provides an explanation of each table, as well as how to toggle between them.

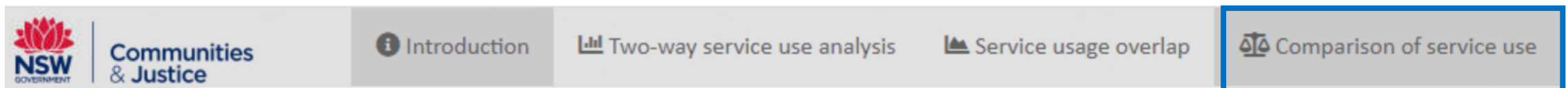
Navigate between the dashboards by clicking on the bar at the top of the page:



1. **Two-way service use analysis:** shows the likelihood that a person will seek homelessness services within a year of accessing other types of government services



2. **Service usage overlap:** shows the proportion of people (out of every 100,000) who accessed different combinations of services, and then went on to access homelessness services within the twelve months following.



3. **Comparison of service use:** compares the frequency of service use between the general NSW population and the 2% of people found to be at highest risk of homelessness (based on their service use history).

Each dashboard allows you to search for different combinations of data

Filter the data displayed in the table by using the left hand menu filters

You can select different options across various demographic filters, and across different vulnerable cohorts.

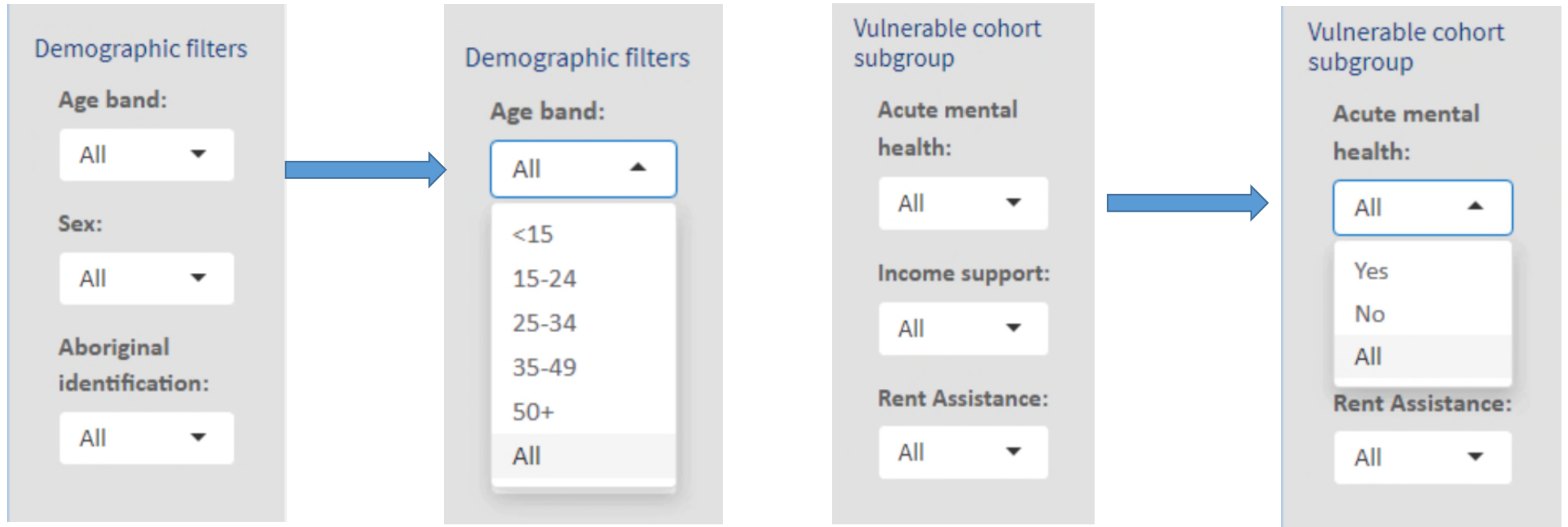
