

This information sheet is about **The Protocol for Homeless People in Public Places**.

We will say **Protocol** for short.



A **protocol** means a set of steps to follow.

What is the Protocol?



Workers and police officers use the Protocol to help you if you do not have a home.

Workers are someone sent by a service to help you.



It also tells you about your rights.

Your rights

If you do not have a home you still have the same rights as people who have a home.

You can



 move around public places like parks and streets



go to public activities or events

Activities means things to do like going to a market.



carry your things or put them in a locker.

Talking to a worker

A worker or police officer may speak to you if



you ask for help



you or someone around you might get hurt



you broke something that is not yours



• you are under 18 years old without a home



• the worker or police officer wants to share information with you.

The worker or police officer must



respect you when they talk to you



listen to you



 get you an interpreter if you want or need one

An **interpreter** is someone who speaks the same language as you



• get you a support worker if you need or want one.



You do not have to talk to the worker if you do not want to.



A police officer will talk to you if you or someone around you is at risk.

Risk means something bad could happen.



The worker or police officer can give you information about a service that can help you.

When you are not happy with the worker



You can ask the worker or police officer for the phone number or email of their service.

Call or email the service if their worker or police officer



has not followed the Protocol



has treated you badly.

The NSW Government checks the Protocol every 4 years.



The NSW Government last updated the Protocol in June 2022.
