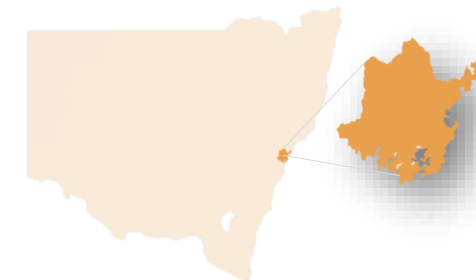


# TFM Family Investment model



## How to interpret this information pack

### Page 2

presents a snapshot of information for the **Central Coast** FACS district coming out of TFM's Investment model.

The information is disaggregated by three groups of vulnerable children and young people born in the **Central Coast**:

#### Central Coast:

- Young children aged 0 to 5
- Children aged under 15 and affected by mental illness
- Children and young people aged 15 to 18 and affected by mental illness.

The final column on page 2 presents the proportion of the vulnerable children in each group who have experienced each of five indicators strongly associated with poorer outcomes in later life.

### Page 3

presents the projected outcomes for **Central Coast** children and young people in each vulnerable group, by the number of indicators they have experienced which are associated with poorer outcomes later in life. The projected outcomes are compared against the average across all NSW children and young people in the same age bracket and expressed as a multiplier (e.g. 1.5x).

Page 3 also presents outcomes for all children and young people classed as vulnerable in **Central Coast** – shaded in blue.

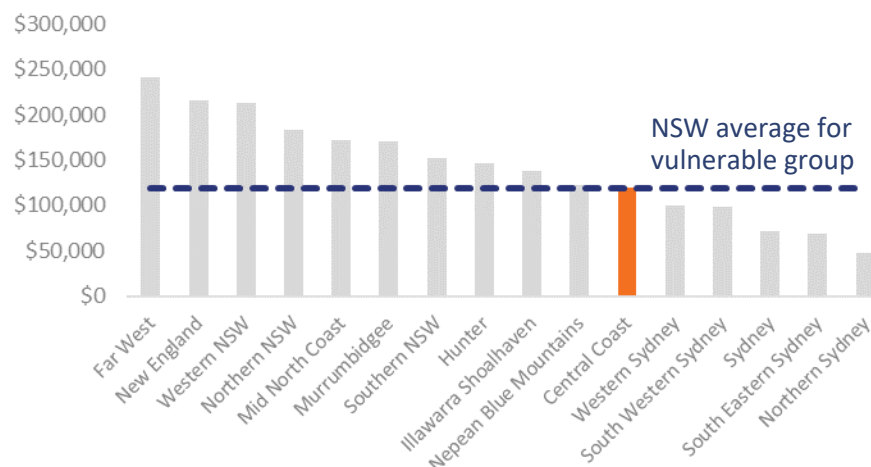
These indicators differ depending on the vulnerable group, however the **consistent finding is that the more vulnerable indicators a child has experience with, the more they are expected to interact with the criminal justice system, social housing, child protection and mental health services.**

### Page 4

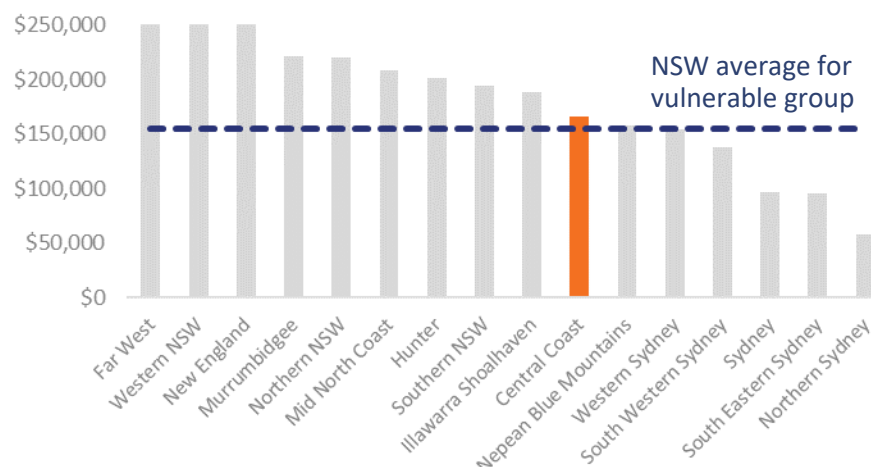
looks at vulnerable groups in the LGA/s of the **Central Coast**. It shows, for each vulnerable group: the number of children and young people in the relevant age bracket, the number in the vulnerable group, the proportion (%) of children and young people classed as vulnerable, and the proportion (%) of children and young people in the vulnerable group who identify as Aboriginal.

## Key findings for the Central Coast FACS district

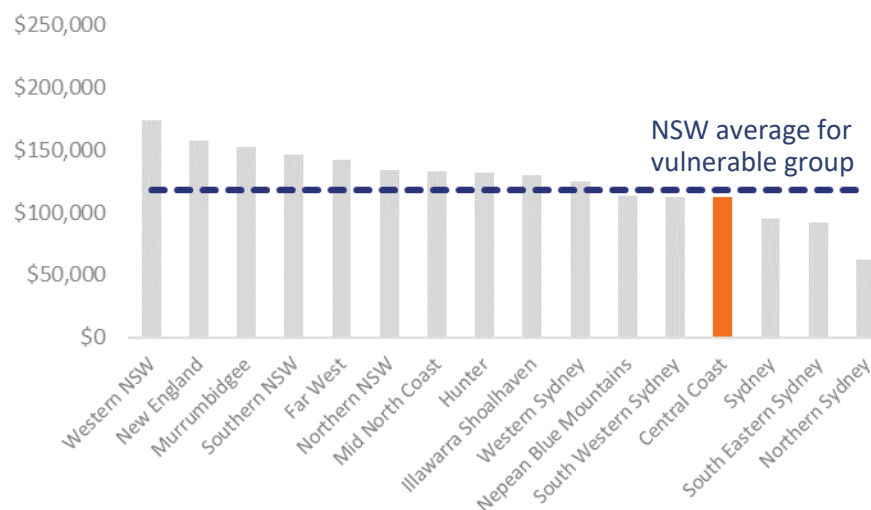
Average future cost to NSW government for **Vulnerable young children aged 0 to 5**

### Key insights for vulnerable young children aged 0 to 5 in Central Coast

- **6<sup>th</sup> lowest out of 16** in estimated future cost to NSW government.
- **37%** of children aged 0 to 5 belong to this vulnerable group (5<sup>th</sup> highest out of 16 FACS districts).
- Projected outcomes for the vulnerable group are similar to the NSW average for this group, e.g. 22% of the vulnerable group are expected to interact with the justice system in the future compared to 21% for the NSW average for this group.

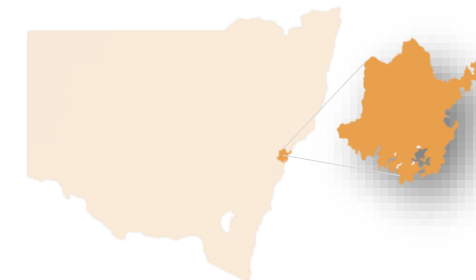
### Key insights for children aged under 15 and affected by mental illness in Central Coast

- **10<sup>th</sup> highest out of 16** in estimated future cost to NSW government
- **15%** of children aged under 15 belong to this vulnerable group (7<sup>th</sup> highest out of 16 FACS districts).
- Projected outcomes for the vulnerable group are similar to the NSW average for this group, e.g. 39% of the vulnerable group are expected to use NSW mental health services. This is slightly above the NSW average for the vulnerable group (37%).

### Key insights for children and young people aged 15 to 18 and affected by mental health in Central Coast

- **4<sup>th</sup> lowest out of 16** in estimated future cost to NSW government
- **19%** of children and young people aged 15 to 18 belong to this vulnerable group (8<sup>th</sup> highest out of 16 FACS districts).
- Projected outcomes for the vulnerable group are similar to the NSW average for this group, e.g. 24% of the vulnerable group are expected to interact with the justice system. This is slightly below the NSW average for the vulnerable group (25%).

# Vulnerable groups by FACS District: Central Coast



Their Futures Matter is focusing on **three vulnerable groups** in NSW

We look at these groups of vulnerable children and young people born in the FACS District of **Central Coast**

We have identified, for each vulnerable group, **five indicators** associated with these children having high service usage and poorer outcomes later in life

## Young children (0 to 5)



Children aged 5 or younger at 30 June 2017 with one or more of the following:

- 1 or more parental risk factors
- 2 or more perinatal risk factors
- Assessment as ROSH+

There are **8,013** children in Central Coast in the vulnerable young children group.

That's about

**1 in 3**



Central Coast children aged 0 to 5.

On average, these children are estimated to **cost the NSW govt \$119k** each for the key human services they use up to age 40



This is **2.0x** the average cost for all NSW children aged 0- 5

## Children aged under 15 and affected by mental illness



Children under 15 years at 30 June 2017 with one or more of the following:

- Use of NSW mental health services (hospital or ambulatory)
- Parental use of NSW mental health services (hospital or ambulatory)

There are **6,448** children in Central Coast in the children aged under 15 and affected by mental illness group.

That's about

**1 in 7**



Central Coast children aged under 15.

On average, these children are estimated to **cost the NSW govt \$166k** each for the key human services they use up to age 40



This is **3.0x** the average cost for all NSW children under 15

## Children and young people aged 15 to 18 and affected by mental illness



Children and young people (C/YP) between 15 and 18 years at 30 June 2017 with one or more of the following:

- Use of NSW mental health services (hospital or ambulatory)
- Parental use of NSW mental health services (hospital or ambulatory)

There are **2,788** C/YP in Central Coast in the C/YP aged 15 to 18 and affected by mental illness group.

That's about

**1 in 5**



Central Coast C/YP aged 15 to 18.

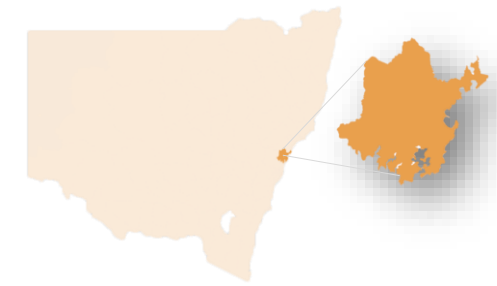
On average, these C/YP are estimated to **cost the NSW govt \$112k** each for the key human services they use up to age 40



This is **2.8x** the average cost for all NSW C/YP aged 15-18

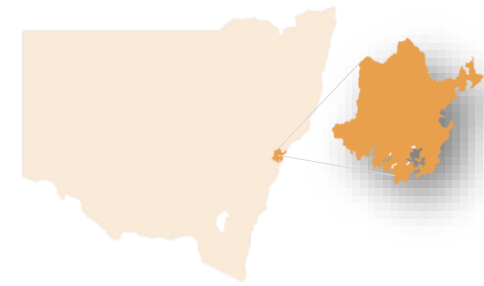
