DCJ Housing offices are appointment only

DCJ Housing offices remain open. However, you need to make an appointment before visiting. This is to keep you and our staff safe.

The easiest way to contact DCJ Housing is through the MyHousing App. All you need is a computer, smartphone or tablet with an internet connection.

The app gives you access to your information 24 hours a day, seven days a week. You can even pay a bill or request a repair through the app.

If you need to come into a DCJ Housing office, you must make an appointment by calling or emailing your local Housing office. Find your local Housing office by visiting www.facs.nsw.gov.au/about/contact/housing.
