The NSW Government continues to lead the nation with more than \$390 million over four years invested to provide greater protection for women, children and men.



2018-19 Budget Highlights

\$26.5 million

FOR START SAFELY

to help people escaping violence move into stable housing in the private rental market.



\$20.6 million

FOR SAFER PATHWAY

which will be state wide by the end of 2018.



\$10.7 million

FOR WOMEN'S DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COURT ADVOCACY SERVICE

to support victims through the criminal justice system.



\$6.9 million

FOR STAYING HOME LEAVING VIOLENCE

to support women and their children remain safely at home.



This investment is in addition to the hundreds of millions of dollars the government spends each year to combat domestic and family violence through mainstream services in justice, police, health, child protection, social housing and homelessness services.
