New Training Requirements for Children's Services

We are aware that under the new NQF, all nominated supervisors and any certified supervisor (person with a supervisor certificate) who is placed in day to day charge of an education and care service in NSW must have completed an approved course in child protection.

The courses which will be 'approved' under the Education and Care Services National Regulations are listed on the NSW DET website: <https://www.det.nsw.edu.au/what-we-offer/early-childhood-education-and-care/regulatory-framework/national-quality-framework/qualifications-and-ratios>.

Does the free training course offered by Community Services meet the requirements under the new regulations?

Although we offer the CHCCHILD401A *Identify & Respond to Children and Young People at Risk* as part of our free training to funded services, we are not a registered training organisation (RTO) and therefore cannot issue a *Statement of Attainment*. Upon completion of the course, we can only provide a *Certificate of Attendance* along with a list of learning outcomes met.

How can I get a *Statement of Attainment* if I prefer to attend this course?

Should you require this *Statement of Attainment*, you will need to identify a registered training provider who offers an assessment component. These assessments may be completed by correspondence or attendance and must be done within three (3) months of completing our course.

Do I need to pay for an assessment by a RTO?

Please note that there is a fee charged by the RTO to complete the assessment. You will need to contact an RTO directly. The Centre for Community Welfare Training (CCWT) offers assessment components for participants who have attended our training. You can contact them directly on 02 9281 8822.
