



# Review of the Disability Inclusion Act 2014

## Key messages

These key messages should be used when communicating about the review of the Disability Inclusion Act.

- The Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) is reviewing the Disability Inclusion Act (the Act) on behalf of the NSW Government.
- The Act outlines the rights of people with a disability in accordance with the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities. It ensures that policies and programs for disability services in NSW align with this UN convention.
- We will use all feedback to evaluate the Act, and ensure it has achieved what it set out to do.
- We will look at what needs to be changed, so that the Act continues to be relevant into the future.

### Consultation on the discussion paper

- We want to make sure the Act continues to reflect the views and experiences of people in NSW. To ensure that this happens, we want to hear from you.
- We've prepared a discussion paper on the review. It gives you an overview of each part of the Act.
- You can provide feedback on the Act in three ways. You can do the online survey, write to us or attend a consultation session.
- All your feedback will inform a report with recommendations about the Act review. The report will be tabled in NSW Parliament for discussion.
